

The Royal Descents of 900 Immigrants

1. William I the Lion, King of Scotland, d. 1214 = Ermengarde de Beaumont
2. (illegitimate by a daughter of Richard Avenal) Isabel of Scotland = Robert de Ros, Magna Carta surety
3. Sir William de Ros = Lucy FitzPiers
4. Sir Robert de Ros = Isabel d'Aubigny
5. William de Ros, 1st Baron Ros of Helmsley = Maud Vaux
6. William de Ros, 2nd Baron Ros of Helmsley = Margery de Badlesmere
7. Elizabeth de Ros = William la Zouche, 2nd Baron Zouche of Haryngworth
8. William la Zouche, 3rd Baron Zouche of Haryngworth = Agnes Greene
9. (probably) Katherine la Zouche = John Tyndal
10. Sir William Tyndal = Alana de Felbrigg, daughter of Sir Simon de Felbrigg (and Margaret of Teschen, alleged daughter of Przemysl I Nosak, Duke of Teschen and Glogau, and Eliska of Beuthen-Kosel), son of Sir Roger Bigod alias Felbrigg and Elizabeth Scales, daughter of Robert, 3rd Baron Scales (and Katherine de Ufford), son of Robert, 2nd Baron Scales and Egeline de Courtenay, daughter of Sir Hugh Courtenay and Eleanor le Despencer, SETH
11. Sir Thomas Tyndal = Margaret Yelverton
12. Sir William Tyndal = Mary Mondeford
13. Sir John Tyndal = Amphyllis Coningsby
14. Sir Thomas Tyndal = Anne Fermor
15. Sir John Tyndal = Anna Egerton. Their son, Arthur Tyndal, also immigrated to Mass., but returned to England and died unmarried.
16. **Margaret Tyndal (Tindal)** of Mass. = **John Winthrop** (1587/8-1649), the colonial statesman, founder and governor of

the Massachusetts Bay Colony (his third wife; Winthrop married secondly Thomasine Clopton, ARD, SETH)

17. Samuel Winthrop of Antigua = Elizabeth —
18. Joseph Winthrop = Catherine Slicer
19. Sarah Winthrop = George Thomas
20. **Sir George Thomas, 1st Bt.** (c. 1695-1774), colonial governor of Pa. and Del. = Elizabeth King.

Hansen on Margaret of Teschen). Col. Hansen thinks that the wife of Sir Simon de Felbrigg was simply a noblewoman in the train of Anne of Bohemia, Queen of Richard II, King of England. Douglas Richardson, who questions the la Zouche descent, thinks, however, that the Teschen descent is correct (see the *RA* references above).

Margaret's alleged father, Przemysl I Nosak (Premislaw I Noszak), Duke of Teschen and Glogau (m. Eliska [Elizabeth] of Beuthen-Kosel), was the son of Casimir I, Duke of Teschen, and Euphemia of Mazovia, daughter of Trojden, Duke of Mazovia, and Maria of Galicia, SETH. The last was a daughter of Youri I, called King of Galicia, and a great-granddaughter of Bela IV, King of Hungary (d. 1270), SETH.
